Synopsis of facts:

Subject presently resides 53 E. 46th St., Chicago, and is Associate Editor for the "Chicago Globe", pressman for group of Negro cab operators on South Side of Chicago, Script writer for OSCAR BROWN, JR., a nominal salesman for Landrum Realty Company. Reportedly born 6/19/18 and served in Navy during World War II. Graduate of Knoxville College, Knoxville, Tenn. Reportedly a CP member from 1946 through 1948, member of the Professional Club, CP, several years ago, and believed to be still presently a member of the CP. Reportedly fired from the "Chicago Defender" in 1948 because of Communist activities. Active in AYD in 1946 and 1947, being on the National Council in 1947. Reported to be a ward chairman of the Illinois Chapter of the Progressive Citizens of America in 1948. Reported active in Progressive Party in 1948 and on mailing list of the American Committee for the Protection of Foreign Born in 1948. Subject's wife believed to be presently a member of CP. Description of subject set forth.

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DETAILS: AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

This investigation is predicated upon information received from Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, in January of 1947 that VERNON JARRETT from the "Chicago Defender", a Communist Party member, had been assigned by the CP to the Publicity Committee working for the election of PETE BROWN as alderman in the Second Ward.

I. BACKGROUND

Residence

On October 20, 1950, WILLIAM H. HIGGINS, Apartment 4B, 53 East 46th Street, advised that VERNON JARRETT and his wife presently reside in Apartment 4C at 53 East 46th Street, having moved there around the first of this year.

Occupation

On October 20, 1950, ROBERT N. LANDRUM, Chairman of the Board of Directors, Landrum Realty Company, 608 East 61st Street, Chicago, advised that VERNON JARRETT of 53 East 46th Street is at this time mainly employed as an Associate Editor of the "Chicago Globe", a Chicago Negro weekly newspaper located at 2705 South Michigan Avenue. LANDRUM advised that JARRETT has been on its staff since the paper's inception in April of 1950.

LANDRUM further stated that the subject is also employed as a press relations man for a group of South Side Negro taxicab operators, commonly known as "Jitneys", in an attempt to have their operation legalized. LANDRUM also related that JARRETT writes the radio script for OSCAR BROWN, JR., a colored news commentator, who has a daily news program over a Chicago local radio station.

LANDRUM also advised that JARRETT is nominally a salesman for the Landrum Realty Company but that he has only made one sale being too busy in his other fields of work.

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Citizenship

Mr. WILLIAM BAXTER COLLIER, JR., President of the Landrum Realty Company, and who resides at 575 South St. Lawrence, advised that the subject was born in Knoxville, Tennessee around 1919.

On October 27, 1950, a review of Marriage Certificate Affidavit No. 2110234 at the Cook County Bureau of Vital Statistics, 130 North Wells Street, reflected that VERNON D. JARRETT, 3639 South Giles Avenue, was born June 19, 1918.

Military Record

WILLIAM COLLIER, JR., Landrum Realty Company, advised on October 20, 1950 that the subject was in the U. S. Navy during 1943 through 1945, serving most of his time at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station in Illinois. COLLIER advised that he believes the subject entered the Navy from Knoxville, Tennessee.

On July 18, 1950, JOHN T. HALTIGAN, Chief Attorney, Veterans Administration, 366 West Adams Street, Chicago, advised that he could not locate a record for subject at this time.

Selective Service Data

On July 18, 1950, ALPERT RYDE, Custodian of records, Illinois State Selective Service Headquarters, 523 South Plymouth Court, Chicago, advised that he could not locate a record for subject at this time.

Education

WILLIAM COLLIER, JR., Landrum Realty Company, advised on October 20, 1950 that the subject attended Knoxville College, Knoxville, Tennessee, from 1936 to 1940 and during that period served as editor of the school paper.

Previous Residence

On October 19, 1950, LOTTIE ELZIE, 4627 South Wabash, Third Floor, advised that VERNON JARRETT, who is now employed at the "Chicago Globe" and his wife, FERNETTA, had resided at this address for about three months previous to

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moving to 53 East 46th Street around January of 1950. She further advised that before marriage, subject resided somewhere on Giles Avenue.

A review of Marriage Certificate Affidavit No. 2110234, on October 27, 1950 at the Cook County Bureau of Vital Statistics, reflected that the VERNON D. JARRETT, who married FERN HOBBS on November 12, 1949 listed his address as 3639 Giles Avenue. ~~JARRETT~~

Mr. WILLIAM COLLIER, JR., Landrum Realty Company, on October 20, 1950, advised that subject had spent all his life prior to entry into service in Knoxville, Tennessee.

#### Previous Employments

On October 20, 1950, WILLIAM COLLIER, JR., advised that after the end of the war the subject joined the "Chicago Defender", a Chicago Negro weekly newspaper, as a reporter.

On August 7, 1950, Confidential Informant T-2, of unknown reliability, but who has been in Negro newspaper work for many years, advised that VERNON JARRETT of Knoxville, Tennessee was employed by the "Chicago Defender" for about two and one half years as a rewrite man. Informant advised that subject came to the "Defender" sometime in 1946 after he was released from service and was released from the paper sometime late in 1948.

#### Criminal Record

A check with the Bureau of Criminal Information and Statistics, Chicago Police Department, against the name of subject conducted by SA JOSEPH B. KILLGORE with negative results on October 17, 1950.

#### Marital Status

On October 27, 1950, a review of Marriage Certificate Affidavit No. 2110234 at the Cook County Bureau of Vital Statistics, 130 North Wells Street, reflected that VERNON D. JARRETT, born June 19, 1918, residing at 3639 Giles Avenue, married FERNETTA HOBBS, born December 18, 1923, residing at 363 East 53rd Place, on November 12, 1949. ~~JARRETT~~

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Miscellaneous

On October 20, 1950, WILLIAM COLLIER, JR., advised that subject and his wife have no children and as far as he knows all of subject's relatives are in Knoxville, Tennessee.

II. ACTIVITIES AND AFFILIATIONS

Communist Party

On December 16, 1946, Confidential Informant T-1 advised that at a small CP meeting held December 16, 1946 at Forum Hall, 43rd Street, VERNON JARRETT, of the "Chicago Defender", was elected on the Campaign Committee to place PETE BROWN on the ballot as an independent candidate for alderman of the Second Ward.

On January 7, 1947, informant further advised that VERNON JARRETT from the "Chicago Defender" was assigned by the CP to the Publicity Committee working for the election of PETE BROWN as alderman in the Second Ward and had attended a meeting that night at 5929 South Prairie Avenue of the Publicity Committee.

On January 8, 1947, T-1 advised that VERNON JARRETT was one of the members present at a CP meeting held for PETE BROWN's campaign at 306 East 43rd Street.

On April 24, 1950, HARRIS B. GAINES, JR., advised SA HERBERT C. POHLMANN and SA JOHN F. GLENVILLE that during the fall of 1948 he was invited to attend three or four meetings held by the Art Guild Club, which he stated was a CP Club consisting of the acting profession. GAINES advised that these meetings took place at the home of RICHARD DURHAM, 6204 South Park Avenue, Chicago. GAINES advised that present at these meetings was VERNON JARRETT who was now associated with the "Chicago Globe". GAINES advised that JARRETT was formerly connected with the "Chicago Defender" but was fired because of Communist activity.

On February 23, 1950, Confidential Informants T-3 and T-4, of known reliability, advised that they knew RICHARD DURHAM as a CP member of

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the Newspaper Club in 1947 and the first half of 1948 when he was then transferred to the Chicago Tarvell Club.

On July 6, 1942, Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, reported that a new organization was formed on the South Side of Chicago that is to be known as the National Conference of Negro Youth. Included among the members of the Chicago Committee was "HARRIS GAINES, JR.". T-5 stated that the Committee included many active Communist Party members.

Confidential Informant T-1 on April 1, 1946 furnished a mimeographed copy of the statement which is critical of the Mayor's Committee on Race Relations, City of Chicago. The statement accuses the Committee of ineffectiveness and incompetence of office as not being able to properly combat racial discrimination among the Negroes. A list of signers is attached to the statement. Included in this list is "HARRIS B. GAINES, JR., Chicago Negro Art Theater".

Also included in this list are other well known Communists such as "WILLIAM L. PATTERSON, Communist Party, Illinois District", as well as other Communist Party members, according to Confidential Informant T-1.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, furnished a circular issued by "People's Housing Conference". It was held on April 28, 1946 at the Metropolitan Community Church. A list of endorsers of the conference included, "HARRIS GAINES, JR., Chicago Negro Art Theater". The circular also reflects the following information: "Address credentials and communications to Room 29, East 43rd Street, Chicago 15, Illinois". Confidential Informant T-6 advised that this address is the South Side Headquarters of the Communist Party, District No. 8. The same informant advised that the People's Housing Conference was controlled and dominated by the CP, District No. 8.

The "Chicago Defender", a weekly Negro newspaper, on December 13, 1947, page 22, column 3, carried an article captioned, "Radio Cast Plans Skit For PCA". The article reflects information that the Negro cast of "Here Comes Tomorrow" will do a skit for the Progressive Citizens of America Carnival Ball held at the Midland Hotel, December 20, 1947. Names included in the cast were "HARRIS GAINES, JR."

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Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, on April 26, 1950 advised that FERN JARRETT, wife of VERNON JARRETT, a free lance writer for Negro publications, served as the office girl for FE-UE during the election contest held under the auspices of the National Labor Relations Board for the purpose of ascertaining whether FE-UE or UAW-CIO was to be the bargaining agent for the employees of the Ingersoll Steel Division of the Borg-Warner Corporation, 1000 West 122nd Street, Chicago. Informant stated that he believes both FERN and VERNON JARRETT to be Communist Party members but he is unable to supply any definite proof. He further stated that FERN JARRETT works full time at the District No. 11 office of UE.

On August 7, 1950, Confidential Informant T-2 advised that the subject had received his job on the "Chicago Defender" in 1946 from Dr. METZ T. P. LOCHARD, former editor of the "Defender", who is now owner of the "Chicago Globe". Informant advised that he believed LOCHARD was a member of the CP although he has no direct proof except that while with the "Defender" LOCHARD, as an editor, continually attempted to follow the CP Line in the paper. T-2 advised that JARRETT was released from the "Defender" sometime in late 1948 because he was considered "red" and "Communist". Informant related that during that period there was a whole house cleaning of members of the "Defender" and that along with JARRETT, Dr. LOCHARD was also released because of believed Communist activities in their continual attempts to follow the CP Line in the editorial policies of the paper. Informant advised that he still sees the subject occasionally and believes that due to his marriage the subject may have settled down. Informant advised that subject appears to be in the stage of laughing about his early "eager" days while on the "Defender".

On October 20, 1950, ROBERT M. LANDRUM, Chairman, Board of Directors, Landrum Realty Company, advised that he has known the subject fairly well for over two years, having associated with him socially as well as in the business world. LANDRUM related that he has not known subject to be involved with Communism and cannot understand why JARRETT should be so involved. LANDRUM stated that if JARRETT had stayed with his company he would be making at least \$10,000 a year. LANDRUM further advised that he believes the subject is too smart to get mixed up with the Communists since he has too much to lose. He further stated that he

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believes the subject is much too busy with his position on the "Globe", writing script for OSCAR BROWN, Jr., and his duties as the press relations man for the "Jitneys", for which he is receiving \$500 a month as a retainer, to have much time for Party work. However, LANDRUM stated JARRETT is very frank and forthright about the Negro problem and is willing to attack any one on the radio or by the press who he believes may be standing in the way of "full Negro equality because of vested interests".

On October 20, 1950, WILLIAM BAXTER COLLIER, JR., President, Landrum Realty Company, advised that he has known JARRETT since they attended Knoxville College together. COLLIER advised that in 1946 and 1947 and maybe part of 1948 the subject was known to have traveled around with a group of people who are commonly known as Communists but whom COLLIER could not recall.

COLLIER further stated that JARRETT now seems to have disassociated himself with that group and seems to have settled down. He further advised that the subject is very outspoken in regard to racial matters regardless of whom it may involve.

On October 20, 1950, Confidential Informant T-1 advised that VERNON JARRETT, who is working presently for the "Chicago Globe", used to be a member of the Professional Section of CP District No. 8 several years ago. However, informant advised that since the subject has joined the "Chicago Globe" he has not seen much of him and does not know of his current activities, if any.

American Youth For Democracy

On June 18, 1946, Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, advised that VERNON JARRETT of the Illinois-Indiana Region of the American Youth for Democracy was elected to the Regional Council of the Illinois American Youth for Democracy.

On June 24, 1946 informant advised that he had learned from LEON GURLEY that GURLEY and VERNON JARRETT, both from the Greater South Side Club of the AYD, had been elected at the AYD National Convention held in New York City, June 13-16, 1946, to the leading body of that organization.



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On October 21, 1946, T-8 advised that VERNON JARRETT told him that he had been invited to speak before the Illinois Tech Forum on the coming Friday on the current elections. JARRETT told informant that some of the boys in the school had succeeded in securing the forum, but that the faculty would not approve of any speaker from any outfit mentioned except the Independent Voters of Illinois. So JARRETT told informant he was being considered as an Independent Voters of Illinois man.

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised in 1945 that FRANK KORNACKER, President of the 49th Ward of the CPA, stated that approximately ten per cent of the members of the Independent Voters of Illinois were Communists. This informant advised that during this period the CPA was making efforts to gain control of the Independent Voters of Illinois.

On October 31, 1946, Confidential Informant T-8 advised that VERNON JARRETT of the "Chicago Defender" was to present a scroll for Wallace under the name of the Independent Voters of Illinois.

On November 7, 1946, Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, advised that VERNON JARRETT had told him that he was going to concentrate more and more of his time on the AYD.

On November 8, 1946, T-10 advised that he had learned from DOLORIES GERRARD that the South Side work was going to change and that she wanted LEON GURLEY and VERNON JARRETT to help her.

On June 18, 1946, T-8 advised that DOLORIES GERRARD had been elected to the National Council at the National Convention of the AYD in New York City.

On January 10, 1947, T-10 advised that VERNON JARRETT told him that he was unable to speak at a meeting of an IWO youth group since he was busy trying to get out petitions in the ward by the following weekend and he had to attend various meetings for this purpose.

It is to be noted that the International Workers Order has been cited as a Communist organization by the Attorney General.

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On February 13, 1947, T-1 advised that VERNON JARRETT attended a concert and reception given by the AYD at Mandel Hall, Chicago University, February 9, 1947.

Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, advised in 1947 that VERNON JARRETT, 3639 Giles Avenue, Chicago, was a member of the National Council of the AYD.

It is to be noted that the AYD has been cited as a Communist organization by the Attorney General.

Progressive Citizens of America

Confidential Informant T-12, of known reliability, advised on January 16, 1948 that VERNON JARRETT was present at the 7th Special Meeting of the Board of Directors, Progressive Citizens of America, Illinois Chapter, held January 12, 1948 at 112 East Walton Street, Chicago.

Confidential Informant T-13, of known reliability, advised that the 1948 Year Book and Buyer's Guide of the Illinois Chapter of the Progressive Citizens of America reflected that VERNON JARRETT, 3639 Giles Avenue, was chairman of the Second Ward of the Progressive Citizens of America in Chicago.

Confidential Informants T-14 and T-15, both of known reliability, advised in December of 1946 that the Progressive Citizens of America was formed in December, 1946 and that the CP supports the Progressive Citizens of America and has urged its members on various occasions to support this organization.

Progressive Party

T-2 advised on August 7, 1950 that the subject was a member of the Progressive Party in 1948, attended rallies and did various work for the Progressive Party.

T-1 in November of 1948 advised that the CP really controls the Progressive Party in Illinois but does not want this known because the Progressive Party would then lose its value to the CP.

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American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born

On November 15, 1948, Confidential Informant T-16, of known reliability, advised that VERNON JARRETT, 3639 Giles Avenue, was on the mailing list of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born and had recently bought a ticket for a raffle being sponsored by this organization.

It is to be noted that the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born has been cited as a Communist organization by the Attorney General.

Miscellaneous

On October 18, 1950, Confidential Informant T-17, an agency that collects security information in the Chicago area, advised that they had no information regarding subject.

On October 20, 1950, WILLIAM H. HIGGINS, Apartment 4B, 53 East 46th Street, Chicago, advised that he knows of no derogatory information regarding subject. He advised that subject and his wife are not friendly with any one in the apartment building and, in fact, scarcely ever seemed to be home.

Additional Information Re FERNETTA JARRETT, nee Hobbs

Confidential Informant T-18, of known reliability, advised on March 9, 1949 that FERN HOBBS, 363 East 56th Place, Chicago, received literature from the Chicago Branch of the Civil Rights Congress.

It is to be noted that the Civil Rights Congress and its affiliates have been designated as a Communist organization by the Attorney General.

On August 7, 1950, T-2 advised that he knew no derogatory information regarding FERNETTA JARRETT, wife of subject, but admitted that he does not know her very well.

On October 20, 1950, ROBERT N. LANDRUM and WILLIAM COLLIER, JR., Landrum Realty Company, advised that as far as they knew FERNETTA JARRETT, wife of the subject, was loyal to this country and they knew of no organizations which she belongs to.

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Information Re "Chicago Globe" and Dr. METZ T. P. LOCHARD

The report of the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, 78th Congress, listed METZ T. P. LOCHARD, Negro Editor of the "Chicago Defender", as a member of the Board of Directors and an instructor of the Abraham Lincoln School.

It is to be noted that the Abraham Lincoln School has been cited as a Communist organization by the Attorney General.

The "Chicago Star" of September 4, 1948 listed the officers and owners of the Progressive Publishing Company, publishers of the "Illinois Standard" which was to replace the "Chicago Star" the following week. METZ LOCHARD Chicago, Ill. was listed as a stockholder.

T-1 on December 2, 1948 advised that the "Chicago Star" was a weekly newspaper dominated and controlled by the Communist Party, which commenced publication in Chicago on April 4, 1946 and ceased publication in Chicago on September 4, 1948. Informant further advised that the "Illinois Standard" was a Communist Party controlled weekly newspaper which succeeded the "Chicago Star" in Chicago when the latter ceased publication on September 4, 1948 and the "Standard" itself ceased publication on January 29, 1949.

The "Illinois Standard" on October 9, 1948, page 7, published a statement of the ownership, management, circulation, etc., of the "Illinois Standard" published weekly in Chicago, Illinois. This article listed as editor METZ T. P. LOCHARD. Chicago, Ill.

On May 18, 1950, Confidential Informant T-19, of unknown reliability, but who has been active in the newspaper business for many years, advised that the "Chicago Globe" was a new Negro newspaper in publication since April 1, 1950, which newspaper was, in his opinion, a Communist front newspaper. He based this belief upon the fact that the following persons, all of whom he described as Communists or sympathizers, were associated with the paper:

- DR. METZ T. P. LOCHARD, Owner
- ROBERT LUCAS, Managing Editor
- JAMES PERSON, Reporter

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Informant advised that he based his opinions of these three men upon radical reviews in keeping with the Communist Party Line expressed by them while working on the newspaper "Chicago Defender". Informant stated that in 1946 JAMES APPERSON had told him that he, APPERSON, was a member of the CP and showed him at that time what he termed a Communist Party membership card.

Confidential Informant T-20, of known reliability, advised in March of 1946 that JAMES APPERSON, 6009 Michigan Avenue, Chicago, was at that time a registered member of the Third Ward, Gannett-Tubman Branch of the CP in Chicago, with registration card no. 51744. According to the informant, APPERSON was a newspaper journalist.

Informant further advised at this time that ROBERT LUCAS, 1131 West 111th Place, Chicago, was a registered member of the Third Ward, Gannett-Tubman Branch of the CP, with registration card no. 49160. According to the informant, LUCAS was a newspaper journalist who had allegedly been in the CP for twenty-nine years.

Information Re OSCAR BROWN, JR.

The October 28, 1949 issue of the "Daily Worker", page 6, columns 2 through 5, reflected an article stating that OSCAR BROWN, JR., age 21, an actor and a radio announcer with a daily news program over WJJD, was running on the Progressive Party ticket for the State Legislature in the First Senatorial District in the heart of the South Side Negro Community.

It is to be noted that the "Daily Worker" is an east coast Communist daily newspaper.

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III. DESCRIPTION

The following description of subject was obtained from T-2 on August 7, 1950, WILLIAM B. COLLIER, JR., and ROBERT N. LANDRUM on October 20, 1950, and from Marriage Certificate Affidavit No. 2110234, Cook County Bureau of Vital Statistics, on October 27, 1950:

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On July 17, 1946, Confidential Informant T-21, of known reliability, advised that one VERNON JARRETT was on the Ruth James Team in the South Side Section of the CP during the 1946 Fund Drive of the CP.

On February 27, 1950, Confidential Informant T-22, of known reliability, advised that the DuBois Theater Guild had announced its new center at the Public Art Center, 3831 South Michigan Avenue, and its opening on January 19, 1949. Informant further advised that one VERNON JARRETT was President.

"The Worker" (DuSable Edition) issue of March 5, 1950, page 2A, columns 1 and 2, reflected that the DuBois Theater Guild was presenting "Of Mice and Men" on March 17-19, 1950 at the Parkway Sky Loft Theater.

On May 17, 1950, Confidential Informant T-23, of known reliability, advised that he had received a leaflet entitled, "Youth for Peace", reflecting that a program and a dance sponsored by the Young Progressives of America (State of Illinois) was being held at the 11th Street Theater, 72 East 11th Street, on May 13, 1950, and that the DuBois Theater Guild was to be presented.

In October of 1949, Confidential Informant T-1 advised that the Young Progressives of America is a youth division of the Progressive Party in Illinois.

The September 17, 1950, Illinois Edition of "The Worker", page 8, columns 2 and 3, reflected that the Pageant for Peace which took place October 8-15, 1950, organized by the Chicago Labor Peace Conference, included among the outstanding cultural groups the DuBois Group.

On November 28, 1949, T-1 advised that the National Labor Conference for Peace is a Communist instigated and dominated organization, which was set up for the purpose of propagandizing for "peace" as that term is interpreted by the Communists.

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Confidential Informant T-24, of known reliability, advised that in November of 1949 one WILLIAM BAXTER COLLIER of 2640 Akwood Boulevard, city unknown, was a member of the United Negro and Allied Veterans of America.

It is to be noted that the United Negro and Allied Veterans of America has been cited as a Communist organization by the Attorney General.

VERNON JARRETT, a Negro, presently resides at 53 East 46th Street, Chicago, Illinois, and is employed as a Public Relations Man at the Landrum Realty Company, 638 East 63rd Street, Chicago, Illinois.

JARRETT is married to FERNETTA JARRETT, nee HOBBS, and is living with her at 53 East 46th Street.

[redacted] advised on April 26, 1950, that he believed the subject to be a member of the Communist Party, but had no definite proof.

CG-5597-S advised on June 18, 1946, that the subject was elected to the Regional Council of the Illinois American Youth for Democracy. This same informant advised on June 24, 1946, that the subject had been elected to the leading body of the American Youth for Democracy at the AYD National Convention held in New York City June 13, to June 16, 1946.

[redacted] advised that the 1948 Year Book and Buyers Guide of the Illinois Chapter of Progressive Citizens of America reflected that VERNON JARRETT was chairman of the Second Ward of the Progressive Citizens of America in Chicago.

[redacted] advised on July 2, 1951, that the subject was given an assignment to prepare a conference story on the Negro press in behalf of the American Peace Crusade.

RUDOLPH also related that he has never heard the name VERNON JARRETT, nor did he know the identity of the individual who had been writing the script for BROWN.

According to T-3, he had ascertained that the main responsibility of the members of this cell was to reach the "middle class," and more specifically to disseminate the Communist Party line among professional people and to indoctrinate others of the middle class, who would otherwise not be exposed to Communist ideas except through cultural associations.

T-6, of known reliability, who is familiar with certain phases of the Communist Party and front organizations in the Chicago area, advised on July 18, 1951, that the subject attended a meeting held on July 15, 1951, at 49th and Wabash Avenue, at which Communist Party members AARON BINDMAN and SAM PARKS led a discussion concerning the Cicero Race Riot.

T-2, supra, advised on August 22, 1952, that the subject was connected with the Communist Party around 1948. T-2 did not know whether the subject was a member during that time. T-2 also advised that he did not know of any present activities on the part of the subject with the Communist Party or Communist Party front organizations.

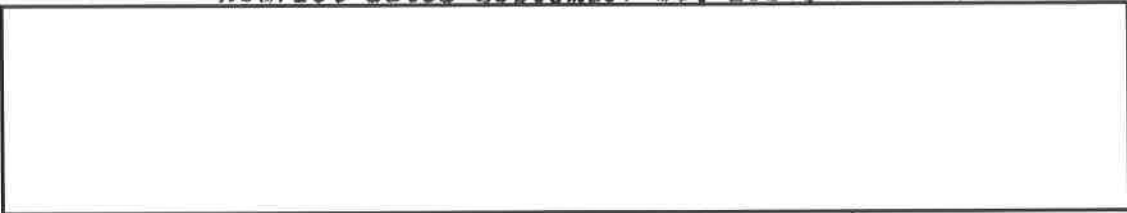

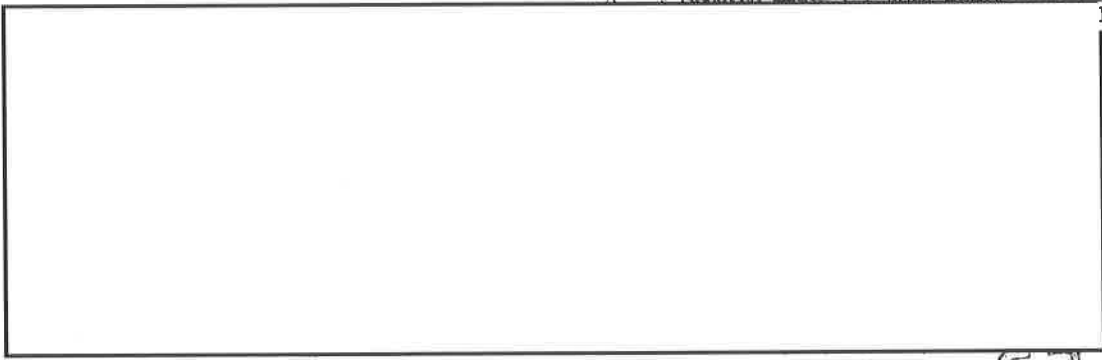

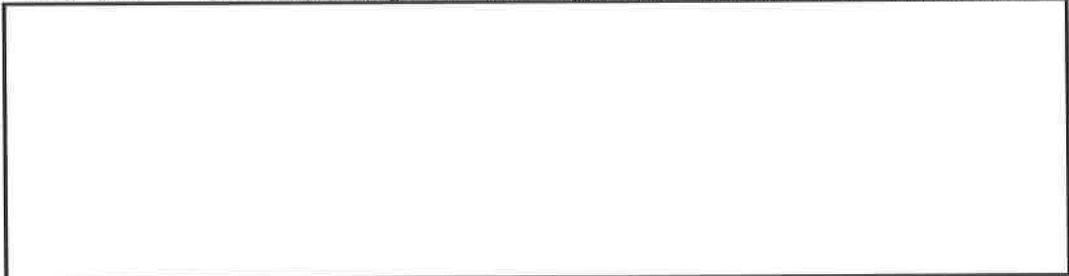
